Jared Miley, Tommy Schirrhofer, Daryl Charlier, Craig Kamicker, Davey Lee, and Justin Pons win on a wild night at Pittsburgh's PA Motor Speedway on May 24, 2008

The Brougner's Machine Shop Crate Lates were the first feature of the night and set the tone for the evening. Tommy Schirrhofer of Dormont, PA grabbed his first win of the season and first win since September 17, 2006. The race started off with a bang, as three cars at the tail of the field tangled at the flagstand, causing the race to be restarted. On the restart front row starting Steve Beatty grabbed the lead, with 6th starting Schirrhofer and 8th starting Daniel Angelicchio moving up to second and third. Beatty led while Schirrhofer and Angelicchio battled for second. Angelicchio moved into second and made several runs at Beatty, but Beatty held him off. Schirrhofer moved back to second on lap 7 and using the high side, made his move past Beatty. Angelicchio also moved past Beatty on lap 8 and went after Schirrhofer. Angelicchio lost a power steering belt on the next lap and did a half spin but recovered and kept going, far behind the leaders. A few laps later Angelicchio dropped out.

Once Angelicchio dropped out, Schirrhofer was home free as he pulled away from the field in a runaway. While Schirrhofer was having an easy time of it up front, all eyes were on the wild battle for second between Beatty, 9th starting Russ Kolesar and 21st starting Daryl Charlier. The trio put on a great show, sometimes going three wide battling for the spot. On the last lap, Kolesar and Charlier swapped the second spot a couple times, as Kolesar moved to second going down the back straight. Then Charlier did a bonsai move going into the third turn, under Kolesar. While he got by briefly, his momentum carried him up the track and he tagged the wall, allowing Kolesar and Beatty to get by at the finish. At the line it was Schirrhofer, Kolesar, Beatty, Charlier, Rocky Kugel (in his first start of the season), Mike Pegher, Josh Holtgraver, Mark Moats Jr., Terry Kerr, and Ken Chernik. Russ Kolesar and Daniel Angelicchio won the heats for the 22 cars on hand.

In the Pizza Hut Late Models, defending track champ Jared Miley from South Park, PA took his second win of the season in an exciting last second pass of John Flinner at the start finish line. Ben Miley and John Flinner brought the field down for the start. Flinner grabbed the lead with 4th starting Jared Miley moving up quickly into second. The front running pair started to pull away from the field as Ben Miley ran third. Steve Baker, who started 9th moved up to 4th on lap three, had set sail for the front runners. Flinner and Miley battled for the top spot and set a torrid pace catching back markers by lap 7. Baker caught Ben Miley and passed him on lap 14. Fourth running Ben Miley spun on lap 13 in turns one and two and Mike Norris, making his first start, blasted him, bringing out the first caution of the event. Both were eliminated. On the restart it was Flinner, Jared Miley, Baker, Lynn Geisler, and 20th starting Davey Johnson, in the new Bill Stile #1J, who was making his first appearance of the season. Flinner and Miley were still going at it for the lead, with Baker behind, while Johnson made his move past Geisler for 5th on lap 14. Johnson set sail for Baker and got by him on lap 17. Geisler's night ended on lap 18, when he broke a ball joint and ended up hard in the first turn wall.

While the yellow was out, Baker's left rear tire went flat, and he pitted for a new one, just making it back out for the restart. Flinner was leading on the restart, with Johnson now by Miley for second with Mike Johnson now fourth.

Another yellow on lap 19 bunched the field up again. Flinner was still up front on the restart, with Miley moving back around Johnson, and Keith Rodriguez in fourth and Mike Johnson in fifth. Flinner and Miley started to pull away, as Davey Johnson broke an upper left front ball joint and slowed his pace. Johnson pulled off on lap 21. Meanwhile Baker was charging up from the tail and was up to 8th on lap 22. Flinner was looking to pick up his first win since September 10, 2005 and was looking strong. But Miley had other ideas, as he pulled even coming down the front straight on the last lap and beat Flinner at the line in a great finish. Miley was first, followed by a disappointed Flinner, Mike Johnson, Keith Rodriguez, Baker, who passed three cars in the last two laps, the previous race's winner Dave Wade, Mike Davis, Brandon Burgoon, Jim Stephans, and Tommy Duratz. The heats fell to Mike Johnson and Lynn Geisler. Twenty-two cars started the main, with 23 in the pits. Kyle Lukon did not start the main after he damaged his frame in the heat. Davey Johnson, Mike Norris, Brad Malcuit all made their first starts of the season.

The Sunoco Race Fuels Pure Stock were next, with Hopewell, PA's Craig Kamicker picking up his first win since October 8, 2006. Joe Anthony grabbed the lead at the start, from his outside pole start. Kamicker moved into second and set after Anthony. Kamicker made his move on lap 7 and took over first. Anthony's fine run ended on lap 8 when something in his rear end broke. Kamicker led the remaining laps, and at the finish it was Kamicker, Bill Robertson, Jake Simmons, Bob Schwartzmiller (who made up several laps using PPMS' Lucky Dog), Robert Betz, Mike Harris, Nick Kocuba, Steve Webb, Mark Perry and Mike Mohn. Craig Kamicker and Nick Kocuba took the two heats.

Up next were the Miley Truck Rental E-Mods, with Daryl Charlier of Midway, PA picking up the win, his first of 2008 in this division. Kevin Miller grabbed the lead from his front row starting spot and led the first two laps. Bruce Dreistadt took over the lead on lap 3 before 9th starting Charlier moved up front on lap 4. Charlier set a fast pace and built up a pretty good sized lead. Last week's winner J.E. Stalder started 12th and moved into second on lap 7. Stalder began to reel Charlier in and caught him on the last lap. Stalder tried to get by coming off turn 4, but ran out of room and tagged the wall. Charlier came across the line first, followed by Stalder who recovered to finish second, Wayne Tessean, Tom Martineck, Chris Basich, Jim Plance, Chuck Kennedy, Denny Nakutis, Kevin Miller, and Willy Briggs. The heats fell to J.E. Stalder and Daryl Charlier.

Defending champ, popular Davey Lee of Independence, PA, drove the Darren Ferguson #54 to its second win of the season. Lee took the lead off early leader Eric Goldberg on lap 4 and never looked back. Craig Koteles making his first start of the season finished second, followed by Curt Bish, Goldberg, J.J. O'Patchen, Tony White, Mike Huchko, Dan Duseheid, Brian Huchko and Edward Wiser. Don Duseheid flipped his car on lap 3 of the main. Brian Huchko and Butch Levandosky took the heat wins. Levandosky did not start the main.

The Imperial Heights Young Guns saw a new winner, with Pittsburgh, PA's Justin Pons grabbing his first career win. Pons took the lead off early leader Tyler Atkinson on lap 4 for the win. Atkinson was second, Rich Mason third, followed by Mike Reft, Todd Janus, Daniel White, Brian Beyerbach, Hannah Ramsey and Sean Graham.
