

Flinner, Moats Jr., Tessean,, Kamicker, White, Graham and Lee Win at Pittsburgh's PA Motor Speedway on July 26, 2008

John Flinner from Cranberry Twp., PA picked up his second win of the season in the Pizza Hut Late Model division. Lou Bradich used his front row starting spot to grab the early lead, with Ben Miley and Brandon Burgoon in tow. Flinner moved into third by lap 3 and gave chase to Bradich and Miley. A yellow came out on lap 8 for C.A. Medved. On the restart Flinner moved by Miley for second. Another yellow came out on lap 10 for Mike Johnson who broke a tie rod end. On the restart, 8<sup>th</sup> starting Flinner (in his new "spec" motor machine) made his move and took the lead off Bradich. From that point on it was all Flinner, as he was never seriously challenged. Jared Miley moved into second at lap 10 and Lynn Geisler moved into third the following lap. A late race yellow on lap 23 tightened the field. On the restart Jared Miley, Geisler and Steve Baker battled for the second spot, with Geisler getting it. Last week's winner Steve Baker, who started 12<sup>th</sup>, slid back several spots after hitting a slick spot and then charged back up thru the field to get up to 4<sup>th</sup>. At the finish it was Flinner, Geisler, Jared Miley, Baker, Burgoon, Ben Miley, Bradich, Tommy Beck, D.J. Miller, and Brandon Wearing. Jim Stephans and Steve Baker took the heats for the 18 cars on hand.

In the Brouger's Speed Shop Crate Lates Mark Moats, Jr. of Hookstown, PA picked up his career first win. Moats, who was looking at a win a few weeks before only to have his hopes dashed after hitting a spun out car, made up for it in a big way winning by a comfortable margin. A first lap spin after one lap for Justin Lamb slowed the pace. On the restart Daryl Charlier got turned around after contact from another car on the front straight and set off a chain reaction crash that eliminated the cars of Russ Kolesar, Justin Lamb, Jeremy Kleemook, Bob Simmons, Colton Flinner, Tim Stefanick, and Terry Kerr. Daryl Charlier returned but only made a couple laps before pitting for the night. Moats grabbed the lead at the start from his 2<sup>nd</sup> starting spot. Once out front Moats opened up a lead, while Bryant Hank moved into second with improving Ken Chernik running third. Last week's winner Tommy Schirnhofner Jr., was on the move from his 12<sup>th</sup> starting spot. Schirnhofner moved by Chernik for third on lap 7 and got by Hank for second on lap 16. At the checker it was Moats Jr., Schirnhofner Jr., Hank, Chernik, Mike Pegher, Scott Schempp, Laura Lukon, Josh Holtgraver, Tyler Dietz, and Bryan Hoffman. The heats saw Daryl Charlier and Tommy Schirnhofner Jr. take victories.

The Miley Truck Rental E-Mods had two features, a rained out one from July 12<sup>th</sup> and the regular go, but the results were the same as Austintown, OH's Wayne Tessean picked up both wins, his 72<sup>nd</sup> and 73<sup>rd</sup> career victories. In the first go, J.E. Stalder grabbed the lead on the first lap and looked as if he was well on the way to picking up the win. But just past halfway, Stalder tagged the wall getting a flat bringing out the caution. J.J. Bametzrieder had the lead on the restart, but Tessean, who was running 3<sup>rd</sup>, swept by on the outside. Meanwhile, Stalder returned to the track after fixing his flat and charged thru the field. Bametzrieder ran second until lap 9, when Daryl Charlier moved into that spot. Charlier only lasted two laps in that spot, as he hit the wall and dropped out. Stalder moved into second at that point but could not catch 7<sup>th</sup> starting Tessean. At the finish it was Tessean, Stalder, Tom Martineck, newcomer Evan Taylor, Jared Domhoff, another

newcomer Jonathan Taylor, Bametzrieder, Chuck Kennedy, Vince Laboon, and Kyle Lukon (in the Willy Briggs #8). In the second main, newcomer Jonathan Taylor took the lead at the start from his 2<sup>nd</sup> starting spot. J.E. Stalder moved from 11<sup>th</sup> into second on lap 6, while Tessean was mired in 10<sup>th</sup>. A restart on lap 7 tightened the field. Chuck Kennedy, who started 8<sup>th</sup> moved into second, and appeared to be ready to challenge Taylor, but tagged the wall and brought out a yellow. Kennedy pitted and changed a flat and returned to the field. Taylor continued to lead, with Stalder in second, while Tessean had moved into third. Taylor looked as if he was going to pick up the win, but a yellow for Clayton Kennedy on lap 10 changed that. On the restart Tessean swept by Stalder and Taylor to grab the lead and pick up the win. At the finish it was Tessean, Jonathan Taylor, Stalder, Kyle Lukon, J.J. Bametzrieder, Evan Taylor, Chuck Kennedy, Jared Domhoff, Clayton Kennedy, and Vince Laboon. J.E. Stalder and Wayne Tessean took the heat wins.

In the Sunoco Race Fuels Pure Stocks, Hopewell PA's Craig Kamicker picked up his second win of the season. Vince Kamicker had the lead on the first lap from his pole starting spot. Craig Kamicker moved into first on lap 4 and led the remaining laps. At the finish it was Craig Kamicker, Jake Simmons, Vince Kamicker (in his best ever finish), Bill Robertson, Nick Kocuba, Bob Schwartzmiller, Pat Weldon, Robert Betz, Mike Mohn, and Dave Slade. The heats fell to Jake Simmons and Craig Kamicker.

The Flynn's Tire and Auto Service Amateur Stocks saw Moon Twp., PA's Tony White earn his second win of the season. White took the lead on the first lap from his pole starting spot and led the entire distance. Eric Goldberg ran second on the first lap but was replaced by Rich Mason on lap 2. Goldberg regained the second spot on lap 3 but lost it on lap 5 to Brian Huchko. At the finish it was White, Huchko, Goldberg, Mason, J.J. O'Patchen, Dan Duseheid, Jason Herniak, Edward Wiser, and Tom McQuillan. Tony White also picked up the heat.

Pittsburgh PA's Shawn Graham, picked up his second feature win of the season in the Imperial Heights Garage Young Gun main event. Graham took the lead at the outset and led the entire distance. Justin Pons took second followed by Mike Reft, Daniel White, Alec Broniszewski, Todd Janus, Tyler Atkinson, Brian Beyerbach and Hannah Ramsey.

A new Wacky Wheels Figure 8 race was held on the front straight, with Independence, PA's Davy Lee picking up the win over Jake Simmons, Andrew Loria, and Kurt Habeldel.
