

Jared Miley, Jake Simmons, Daniel Angelicchio, Daryl Charlier, Jeff Broniszewski, and Justin Pons win at Pittsburgh's PA Motor Speedway on August 23, 2008

Point leader Jared Miley, of South Park, PA, won his third feature of the season in the Pizza Hut Late Models in a hard fought event. Brandon Burgoon grabbed the lead at the outset of the event. Burgoon pulled out to a considerable lead, while positions changed rapidly behind him, as 8th starting Jared Miley, Lynn Geisler, 12th starting Steve Baker, and 9th starting John Flinner moved up to the front. The only yellow of the race appeared on lap 4 when fourth running Jim Stephans and Steve Baker tangled, with both ending against the wall. However, Baker did not stop and got his spot back, while Stephans was relegated to the tail. Burgoon continued to lead on the restart, with Jared Miley in second. Burgoon and Miley pulled away, as Geisler, Baker and Flinner battled for third. Miley continued to put pressure on Burgoon, as both young drivers put on a whale of a show for the top spot. Flinner moved into third on lap 16, while Geisler and Baker battled for fourth. As the race wore on, Burgoon's car started to get a little tight, and it cost him on lap 18, as Miley was able to drive by on the low side coming off turn four. Miley was able to lead the remaining laps to pick up the win. Burgoon was second with Flinner in third, followed by Geisler, Baker, Tommy Beck, Ben Miley, Keith Rodriguez, Jim Lepro and last starting Kyle Lukon trailing. Heats for the 22 cars on hand went to John Flinner and Jared Miley.

The Sunoco Race Fuels Pure Stocks saw the 17th annual Pure Stock 20 event, and McKees Rocks, PA's Jake Simmons picked up his third win in a row in the classic and third win of the season. Pat Weldon led the first 4 laps before Simmons took over. Simmons led the rest of the way, but it was not an easy win, as Weldon challenged him the entire way. Nick Kocuba and Bill Robertson battled for third and both kept pressure on Weldon for second as the first four cars ran together all the way. At the finish it was 4th starting Simmons, Weldon, 8th starting Robertson, Kocuba, 14th starting Bob Schwartzmiller, Chuck Gebauer, Vince Kamicker, A.J. Poljak, Robert Betz and Bobby Heim. Two red flags occurred during the event, as two cars flipped. Brandon Johnston flipped on lap 1 of the feature, and Mitch Wattelet flipped on lap 15. Twenty-one cars were hand for the event, with Craig Kamicker (who lost a wheel while running fifth in the feature), Pat Weldon and Jake Simmons winning the heats, while Weldon also picked up the dash.

In the Brougner's Machine Shop Crate Late Model main, Greensburg, PA's Daniel Angelicchio picked up his first win of the season and second career PPMS win. While it was a great night for Angelicchio, it was a heartbreaker for Rocky Kugel. Kugel, who took the lead on lap 2 and weathered several cautions, looked to have the car to beat. But luck wasn't with him, as on lap 10 he slowed and dropped out of the event. Angelicchio, who started on the pole and led the first lap but dropped back as far as fourth at one point, had worked his way back to second and took over first when Kugel dropped out. The first ten laps were a caution-laden affair, with a wild battle for second occurring. Dave Wade (subbing for Jason Rider) ran second on laps 3 and 4, when Daryl Charlier moved into that spot. Charlier was replaced by Angelicchio on lap 8. Wade was running third when he spun in turns 3 and 4 and collected 12th starting Mike Pegher, Jr. and Ken Chernik,

knocking all out of the event. Tommy Schirnhofner, Jr. charged from 13th to fifth by lap 8, but tagged the wall on the back straight and got a flat and brought out a caution. He changed the flat and returned to action. Once out front, Angelicchio pulled away from the field. Daryl Charlier was second at the finish followed by Justin Lamb, for his best career finish, and was trailed by Tommy Schirnhofner, Jr., Josh Holtgraver, Mark Moats, Jr., Scott Schempp, Laura Lukon, Bryan Hoffman and Russ Kolesar. Heats for the 22 cars fell to Daniel Angelicchio, Mike Pegher, Jr., and Dave Wade.

The Miley Truck Rental E-Mods saw Midway, PA's Daryl Charlier win his third feature of the season and first since June. It was an exciting event that saw Bruce Dreistadt lead the first two laps before 9th starting Charlier took over. In an uncharacteristic move, Charlier ran a tight inside groove instead of his usual high line. Wayne Tessean, who started 7th, moved into second and battled Charlier the entire distance as the pair swapped the lead several times. At the finish it was Charlier followed by Tessean, with J.E. Stalder (who recovered from a lap 3 spin), Chuck Kennedy, Kevin Miller, Vince Laboon, Tom Martineck, Dreistadt, Clayton Kennedy, and Joel Johns. Chuck Kennedy and J.E. Stalder won the heat races.

Coraopolis, PA's Jeff Broniszewski won his first Flynn's Tire and Auto Amateur Stock main in his first effort in the class. Broniszewski, who was driving the #21 Ian Tomei machine, took the lead on lap two off Brian Huchko and led the remaining distance. Craig Koteles ran second followed by Eric Goldberg, J.J. O'Patchen, Jason Herniak, Edward Wisner, Dan Duseheid, Tom McQuillan, and Brian Huchko. Brian Huchko took the heat win.

The Imperial Heights Garage Young Guns saw point leader Justin Pons, from Pittsburgh PA, grab his fifth win of the season. Pons took the lead on lap 5 from Alec Broniszewski and led the remaining laps. At the finish it was Pons, Broniszewski, last week's winner Daniel White, Hanna Ramsey, Brian Beyerbach and Sean Graham.
