

Jared Miley wins Super Late Feature at Pittsburgh's PA Motor Speedway on Night 2, April 25, 2009. Also picking up wins were Dave Wade, Craig Koteles, Daryl Charlier, Curt Bish and Justin Pons.

Defending champion Jared Miley, of South Park, PA, picked up his first win of the season in the DIRTcar Super Late Models. Lynn Geisler and Jim Stephans brought the field down for the start. Geisler grabbed the lead at the start and led the first lap. Seventh starting Miley moved up quickly and took over the lead on lap two and began to open up a lead in his "open" motor car. Meanwhile, last week's second place finisher Steve Baker moved past Geisler on lap 8 and set sail after Miley. A caution on lap 15 tightened the field up and allowed Baker to pull alongside Miley on the restart, but Miley grabbed the lead. On the next lap, Baker got a run coming off turn four and ducked to the inside coming down the front straight and sliding past Miley going into turn one, only to slide up too high and tag the wall, allowing Miley to shoot back into the lead. Baker continued in second and chased Miley until a lap 18 caution, when Baker had to pit with a flat. At this point it was all Miley as he sped away to the win. John Flinner, in another "open" motor machine, just edged Ben Miley for second. Tom Beck charged up from 12 to finish 4th, followed by the steady Brandon Burgoon. Rounding out the top ten were Jim Stephans, Mike Johnson, Lynn Geisler (who recovered from an earlier flat), Lou Bradich, and Baker (who returned after changing the flat). Mike Johnson (in his "open" motor machine) and Brandon Burgoon picked up the heat wins.

In the Brougner's Machine Shop Pro Late Models, Dave Wade, from Clinton, PA, returned to action after missing part of last season and picked up the win. Justin Lamb, who lost a heartbreaking feature last week, lost this feature in much the same fashion. Lamb grabbed the lead at the start and weathered several cautions to lead the first 15 laps without any problems, with Wade running second most of the way. A caution on lap 16 changed all that. On the restart, Wade was able to stay with Lamb and eventually challenge him. Wade pulled ahead slightly to lead laps 17 and 18. Lamb was back ahead on lap 19 and was looking to avenge last week's loss, when Wade got a tremendous run off the bottom on turns three and four. Lamb slipped up a bit coming off the turn, allowing Wade to nip him at the line by ½ a car length. Jason Rider also returned to action and charged from 15th to finish third, followed by Bryant Hank, Beau Glemba, Mark Moats, Jr., Dusty Curry, Laura Lukon, Scott Schempp and Ken Chernik. Ken Chernik, Beau Glemba and Rocky Kugel took the heat wins.

Finleyville, PA's Craig Koteles picked up his first win of the season in the Sunoco Race Fuels DIRTcar Sportsman division. Koteles grabbed the lead on lap 7 off early pacesetter Pat Weldon and held off a fast Bob Schwartzmiller to pick up the win. Weldon was third followed by Bill Robinson, Pat Hanley, Vince Kamicker, Joe Koteles, Dave Slade, Tyler Fox, and Todd Janus. Bill Robertson and Bob Schwartzmiller grabbed the heat wins.

Tenth starting Daryl Charlier, of Midway, PA, grabbed the lead off Brad Westover on lap 2 to pickup his first win of the season in the Miley Truck Rental UMP Modifieds. Charlier dominated the event winning by a straightaway over J.E. Stalder. Kevin Miller was third, followed by Chris Basich, Clayton Kennedy, surprise visitor Vic Vandergrift,

Tom Martineck, Westover, Jared Domhoff and Rich Curry, who returned to the racing wars after a long layoff. The heats saw J.E. Stalder and Kevin Miller pick up wins.

In the Flynn Tire and Auto Factory Stocks, Curt Bish, from neighboring town Oakdale, PA, picked up his first win of the season. Brian Huchko was second followed by Brian Reddcliff, Gary Koteles, Jason Herniak, Garrett O'Patchen, Rich Mason, Jennifer Barker, Todd Busch, and Edward Wiser. Gary Koteles and Brian Huchko won the heats.

Pittsburgh, PA's Young Guns Sport Compacts defending champ Justin Pons won his first race of the season in a wild race. Daniel White was second, followed by Tyler Carlson, Hanna Ramsey, Alec Broniszewski, Brittney Davis, Nico DiBacco, and Tyler Atkinson.
