

Jared Miley wins third, Mark Moats Jr., Craig Koteles, Daryl Charlier, Gary Koteles and Ricky Steigerwald win at Pittsburgh's PA Motor Speedway on Sunday June, 28 2009.

South Park PA's Jared Miley came from the 12th spot and capitalized on some others misfortune to pick up his third Super Late Model DirtCar win of 2009. Daryl Charlier grabbed the lead from his outside front row starting spot and quickly took the lead. Fifth starting Steve Baker moved into second at the end of the first lap and chased the high flying Charlier down. Baker got by when Charlier bobbled in one and two on lap 7. At that point it looked like the race was Baker's as he began to pull away from the field. But misfortune struck on lap 13, when he got a hole in his oil filter and slowed down and pitted. Charlier retook the lead at that point but a yellow on lap 14 (for John Flinger who got a flat) allowed last week's winner Brandon Burgoon to close up. Burgoon followed Charlier for a lap on the restart and then took the lead on lap 16. Burgoon looked strong, but Miley moved from 12th to second on lap 19. Daryl Charlier's day ended on lap 22 when his right rear exploded. The restart allowed Miley to be beside Burgoon on the restart and on lap 24, Burgoon pushed up in the turn and that was all Miley needed to get by. Burgoon was second followed by Lynn Geisler, Tommy Beck, Mike Johnson, John Flinger, Jim Stephans, Ben Miley, Larry Marks and Jim Lepro. It marked the sixth win for the open motors this season, with the "spec" motors having only four. The two heats saw Jared Miley and John Flinger grab wins.

In the Brougner's Machine Shop Pro Crates, Hookstown PA's Mark Moats Jr. picked up his second win of the season. Moats used an inside front row starting spot to grab the lead at the start. While Moats led most of the distance it wasn't an easy win. Last weeks winner Tom Schirnhofner Jr., moved into second and began to challenge him on lap 2. Schirnhofner passed Moats on lap 6, but Moats was ahead again on lap 7. A tangle on lap 8 brought out the first caution and eliminated the cars of point leader Rocky Kugel and Bryan Hoffman. Moats continued to lead on the restart with Schirnhofner in hot pursuit. Another yellow occurred on lap 11 when Justin Lamb broke an axle and Jason Rider and Mike Reft tangled. Beau Glemba moved into second on the next to the last lap, but could not make a pass. At the end it was Moats Jr., Glemba, Schirnhofner Jr., a returning Kyle Lukon (who now has a crate motor), Laura Lukon, Scott Schempp, John Flinger, Reft, Terry Kerr, and Josh Holtgraver. Mike Opalinski had the misfortune to roll his car in the first heat. The heats saw Rocky Kugel and Kyle Lukon win.

In the Sunoco Race Fuels UMP Sportsman, Finleyville PA's Craig Koteles won his second feature of the season. It was a wild event where it really didn't pay to be the leader until the end. Danny Rich grabbed the lead at the start from the pole. Bob Schwartzmiller ran second to Rich the first two laps, when Bill Robertson moved into second. Chris Schneider moved into second on lap 5 and began to pressure Rich as the race wore on. On lap 12, Schneider did a "death slide" on Rich, and that saw Rich end up in the wall. On the restart Bob Schwartzmiller was in front with Bill Robinson in second and Schneider in third. At this point the 11th starting Koteles was now up to fourth. On lap 14 Schwartzmiller, Robinson, and Schneider went into turns one and two three wide, and Schneider did another slide job on Robinson, knocking Robinson into the fence. The officials made the decision to D.Q. Schneider at this point. On the restart Koteles got by

Schwartzmiller, and led the last two laps to grab the win. Schwartzmiller was second followed by Nick Kocuba, Wayne Carbo, newcomer Mike Krueger (who was in from Sparta WI), Robert Betz, Pat Hanley, Joe Koteles, Dave Slade, and Brandon Johnson. The three heats were taken by Chris Schneider, Jake Simmons, and making his first start of the season, Bobby Heim.

While Midway PA's Daryl Charlier had a few problems in the Super Late Model Feature, he had none in the Miley Truck Rental UMP Modified event. Charlier grabbed the lead on lap one from his pole starting spot, and was never seriously challenged in picking up win #4. Kari Gasser moved into second on lap one, but could not muster a challenge on Charlier. Clayton Kennedy was third in a solid run followed by Tom Martineck, Jared Domhoff, Kevin Miller, J.J. Bametzrieder, Jim Petrelle, and newcomer Deana Groves (daughter of Late Model/E-Mod front runner Dave Groves). The heat races saw Daryl Charlier and Tom Martineck grab wins.

In the Flynn's Auto and Tire Factory Stocks, Bentleyville PA's Gary Koteles picked up his fifth win of the season. It was also only the third time in the tracks history that brothers won on the same night, as Dave and Mike Johnson picked up Late Model and Limited Late wins twice on the same night on June 30 1993 and August 14 1993. Koteles had a hard time of it, as he came from 4th starting spot to move into second on lap 1. Robby Torrens grabbed the lead on lap 1, before Koteles took over on lap 2. Koteles led until lap 5, when Torrens was back up front. Koteles was back in front on lap 6 and led the rest of the way. At the finish it was Koteles, Torrens, Garrett O'Patchen, Tony White, Edward Wisner, Jennifer Barker, Brian Huchko, Curt Bish and Rich Mason. Brian Huchko won the heat.

The Imperial Heights Garage Young Guns saw Robinson Township PA's Ricky Steigerwald grab win #5 for the season. Steigerwald started third and grabbed the lead off pole sitter and early leader Justin Pons on lap 3 and never looked back. Alex Broniszewski got by Pons on the last lap to get second, with Pons ending up third. Nico DaBecco was fourth followed by Daniel White, Hannah Ramsey, Travis Walsh, Tyler Atkinson and Tyler Carson.
